The Weather Service reported that the storm had dropped seven inches of snow in Goodland, with accumulations deeper going west, about 10 inches in Kanorado, 8-10 inches in Burlington and 10-12 inches in Idalia.

As the storm slowly began to move out on Thursday, Kansas Department of Transportation maintenance crews were working to clear the highways as quickly as possible.

"We are plowing both east and west on I-70 right now," said Greg Wicker, maintenance superintendent in Norton. "We are trying to keep up with the storm and blowing conditions.
