Roller blade facility planned for Gulick Park

The Goodland Star-News Goodland's Gulick Park could become a regional center for in-line skating as part of a beautification project being spearheaded by the Sherman County Community Foundation.

A task force is looking at turning Gulick Park into a skate park complete with a roller-hockey rink, a stunt area and redesigned playground equipment.

Schyler Goodwin, a member of the Gulick Park task force, said he had been wanting a skate park in Goodland for quite a while.

He said that he knows of several kids right now who play hockey and more who ride skateboards.

"I've been wanting one ever since I moved back to Goodland," he said.

Right now the project is in the first of seven phases, which will include a public meeting at 6 p.m. Thursday, April 10.

Phases two through seven consist of developing a "big picture" plan, identifying positive and negative aspects of the project, design and details, how to handle future maintenance, and how the skate park will fit into the foundation's "global beautification plan."
