Salina, Topeka, Hays, Wichita name area best

Norton Community High School seniors Dan Roeder, Charlie Foley, C.J. Thiele, Jered Sloan, Joel Griffiths, Sean Lauer, Jordon Haussermann and Kai Mann, Logan senior Tyson Triplett and Northern Valley senior Ryan Shearer have received All-State honors for the 2003 season from the Hays Daily News, Salina Journal, Wichita Eagle and Topeka Capital-Journal daily newspapers.

Roeder, a 6'1" 175-pound quarterback and linebacker, was named to the *Hays Daily News* Journal All-Area Top 11. He also received honorable mention in Class 3A in the *Eagle* and *Capital*-

During his two seasons as starting quarterback at Norton, Roeder threw for 2,688 yards and ran for 2,128 yards, for a total of 4,816 yards of total offense.

Foley was a first team Class 3A kicker in the *Eagle* and *Capital*-Journal and was named to the 11-Man Second Team by the *Hays* Daily News and received honorable mention in the Salina Journal. Foley is 5'8", 162 pounds, and the all-time leading kicker in Norton Community High School history. He had 53 consecutive extra-point kicks this season before missing, which ranks him second all-time in Kansas in all classes. In three years of kicking, Foley has been successful on 142 extra-point kicks, which ranks him No. 3 in the state of Kansas all-
