Dana Estelle McDaniel, 97, died Nov. 17, 2003, at the Good Samaritan Nursing Center in Ellis. She was born Sept. 2, 1906, in Spadra, Ark., the daughter of D. F. "Doc" and Amy Gertrude (Ragon) Kinney.

On Dec. 15, 1932, she and Lowell W. McDaniel of Brewster were wed. They were married 56 years before his death in May of 1989.

Following graduation from the College of the Ozarks in Clarksville, Ark., Mrs. McDaniel came to western Kansas to teach school. She moved to Norton in 1939, where she taught school. In the late 1940s, she owned and operated a beauty salon.

In 1962, Mr. and Mrs. McDaniel relocated to Beloit where they purchased a self-service laundry/dry cleaners. She continued to operate a beauty salon in Beloit. From 1997 to 2002 she lived in Plano, Texas. In May of 2002, she lived in Ellis.

Mrs. McDaniel lived an active

life. She enjoyed music, her home, gardening, painting, being a business woman and social and professional groups.

She was preceded in death by her parents, her husband, three brothers and three sisters.

Survivors include her son, Dolan K. and Pat McDaniel, Richardson, Texas; her daughter, Sandra D. McDaniel, Hays; five grandchildren; nine great-grandchildren; and two great-great-grandchildren.

Funeral services were held today in Beloit at the First United Methodist Church with Pastor Ken Parker officiating. Organist, Jean Nyberg, accompanied vocalist, Rita Rowh.

Burial was in Elmwood Cemetery, Beloit.

Don Sanderson, 80, died this week of an apparent heart attack. He was a lifelong resident of Norton.

Mr. Sanderson was born Feb. 18, 1923, in Reager to Joe and Madge Sanderson.

He was a cattleman all his life. In the 1950s he joined his father in the cattle business and continued in the cattle buying business the rest of his life. His son, J. D. Sanderson, joined him and carried on the Sanderson tradition of a fine cattle buyer.

His passion in the last few years was golf and most days would find him out on the course. He enjoyed time spent with his family on trips to Lake Powell, Utah; to DisneyWorld; and Aspen, where he learned to ski when he was 52.
