Pearl M. Alexander

Pearl M. Alexander, 95, a former social worker in Decatur County, died Jan. 9, 2001, at the Decatur County Good Samaritan Center in Oberlin.

She was born May 26, 1905, in a sod house one mile northwest of Lyle, one of three children born to Harvey and May (Taylor) Alexander. When she was four years old, the family moved to a farm southeast of Lyle, where she attended country school at District 10. She graduated from Norcatur High School in 1926 and furthered her education for three years at college in Manhattan and Hays.

She taught school for 19 years in Decatur and Norton counties before becoming a social worker. She worked in Decatur County for six years, then became welfare director in Wallace and Rawlins Counties for 17 years. She was a member of the Norcatur United Methodist Church and Rebekah Lodge and a past member of Business and Professional Women's Club and had served as a Kansas State board member. After retiring, she moved to Norcatur for a time before moving to Oberlin.

Survivors include a brother, Glenn and Pearl Alexander, Norcatur; a sister, Ivah Alexander, Oberlin, and nephews and nieces.

Her parents preceded her in death. Funeral services were held Friday morning at the United Methodist Church in Norcatur. The Rev. Dale Thiele officiated and burial was at the Norcatur Cemetery.
