WHEREAS, the Board of Education (the Board") of Unified School District No. 294, DecaurCountyKansas(Oberlin)(the "District"), deems tadvisable to authorize and provide for the calling of a bond election in the District for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors of the district he question of issuing general obligation bonds of he District to pay the costs of certain school

and advisable to: (i) construct, furnish and equip additions to the existing Oberlin Elementary School o create a new media center (library), restrooms additional classrooms, storage and corridors: (ii) emodel and make improvements to, including eating, ventilation, air-conditioning, and electrial upgrades to the existing Oberlin Elementary School for educational purposes and for compli ADA); (iii) remodel and make improvements. ncluding heating, ventilation, air-conditioning and electrical upgrades to the existing Decatur Comnunity Jr./Sr. High School; and (iv) make all other cessary improvements appurtenant thereto (the Project") at an estimated cost of \$5.871.130.

SECTION 2. SECTION 6. Prior to the submission of said proposition to the electors of the District, the Board shall make application to the State Board of Education for authority to vhhhhissue the bonds in excess of the statutory limitation of a percentage of the assessed valuation of tangible taxable property of the District (the "Debt Limit"), and to call and hold an election to issue the Bonds in excess of such Debt Limit

SECTION7. Notice of the filing of an application with the State Board of Education, as stated above, shall be given to the electors of the District by publication one time in a newspaper of general rculation in the District as provided by law.


