## Neva Addleman

Neva Addleman, 92, mother of Rusty Addleman of Oberlin, died March 20, 2001, at Cedar Living Center in Oberlin.

She was born Dec. 17, 1908, in Humeston, Iowa, the second of three children of Charles A. and Winifred (Aldrich) Russell. She attended grade school in Humeston, graduated from Technical High School in Omaha in 1926, and from nurses training at University Hospital in Omaha in 1929.

She moved to Oberlin in 1930 to accept a position as head of the nursing staff at Benton Memorial Hospital, which had just been newly established.

She married Theodore B. (Ted) Addleman on Feb. 14, 1931, in Aurora, Neb. They made their home in Oberlin where he was a pharmacist at Addleman Drug Store. She resigned her job at the hospital to remain at home and rear their family.

During World War II, the family lived in Illinois and Washington while her husband served in the U.S. Medical Service Corps. They returned to Oberlin in 1945.

She was an active member and served in many capacities at the Presbyterian Church and later the United Church of Oberlin; P.E.O.; Order of Eastern Star, and Girl Scouts. In 1976, she served as the Grand Electa in the Grand Chapter Eastern Star of Kansas.

She and her husband celebrated almost 60 years of marriage and over 70 years of business at Addleman Drug Store. He preceded her in death on Jan. 25, 1991.

Survivors include two sons, Alan Addleman, Estes Park, Colo., and Rusty and Sharon Addleman, Oberlin; a daughter, Ruth Ann and Robert W. Ingold, Lenexa; seven grandchildren; and nine great-grandchildren.

She was also preceded in death by her parents; a brother, Albert Lee Russell, and a sister, Mildred Russell. Memorial services were held Saturday at the United Church of Oberlin. The Revs. Nolan and Barbara Pierce officiated, with Order of Eastern Star rites. Private inurnment services were at the Oberlin Cemetery.
