#### **Floyd Eiler**

Floyd Charles Eiler, 82, a 1936 graduate of Decatur Community High School, died April 5, 2001, at the Decatur County Hospital.

He was born Jan. 6, 1919, at Oberlin, the son of H. Howard and Lena Florence (Reasoner) Eiler. He was reared on a farm north of Oberlin and attended Oberlin Elementary School and Decatur Community High School.

After graduating, he continued to work on the family farm. In March 1942, he joined the U.S. Army. He served four years and took part in five major battles in Europe in World War II and received the Bronze Star and Good Conduct Medal. He was a member of the Oberlin American Legion.

He married Mary Mae Perkins on June 8, 1952, in McCook. They made their home on the family farm until moving to Oberlin in recent years.

Survivors include his wife, Mary; sons, Roger and Sharon Perkins, Laurel, Md.; Ron Eiler, Lawrence, and Dan Eiler, Oberlin; a brother, Harry and Beverly Eiler, McCook; two sisters, Pauline and Vernon Loomis, Denver, and Phyllis and Dole Metcalf, Oberlin; four granddaughters, and three great-grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by his parents; a brother, Bob Eiler, and a sister, Margaret Hurlbut. Memorial services were held Saturday afternoon at Pauls Funeral Home in Oberlin. The Rev. Nolan Pierce officiated. A private family inurnment will be held at a later date.

Memorials were established to the American Cancer society or Hospice of Decatur County.


