Most of the workshops are free. They will help those being laid off and make the transition as smooth as possible. Rapid Response services offer support to both employers and employees and also provide important information for employees.

Once employees are notified of the layoff date, employers can make arrangements for the Rapid Response team to visit the job site. Conducting the meeting prior to the separation date allows workers time to consider their options before the actual layoff. During the meeting, the team explains pertinent informa-

ing the prospect of unemployment. It also provides pre-layoff information on Unemployment Insurance, dealing with the personal and financial impact of unemployment as well as information on the various programs offered through the Workforce Network. Employees who attend the Rapid

Response meeting have the option of being contacted by a case manager. During the one-on-one meeting, employees complete a skill assessment and begin to develop an employment plan with specific career goals. It may include services from job search assistance to classroom training or on-the-job training.
