Robert D. Hickert

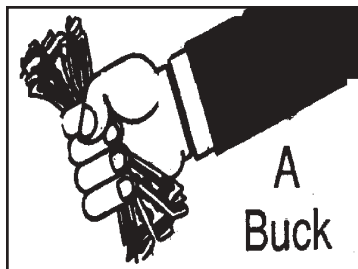
Robert D. Hickert, 61, a native of Jennings, died Jan. 30, 2003, at his home in Brighton, Colo.
