In the Matter of Declaration of Roads to be closed or to be declared as Minimum Maintenance in Prairie Dog Township

- 7) The line between Sections Nineteen and Thirty
- 8) The south 1/2 mile of the east line of Section Twenty-five
- 9) The line between Sections Thirty and Thirty-one
- 10) The east line of Section Thirty-six

AND, that the following roads MAY be closed:

- 1) The north line of Sections One, Two, Three, Four, Five and Six
- 2) The line between Sections Seven and

- Eight
- 3) The west 3/4 mile of the line between Sections Ten and Fifteen
- 4) The line between Sections Twelve and Thirteen
- 5) The south 1/2 mile on the east line of Section Twelve
- 6) The east line of Section Thirteen
- 7) The line between Sections Seventeen and Twenty
- 8) The south 1/2 mile of the line between Sections Seventeen and Eighteen
- 9) The west line of Sections Eighteen and Nineteen
- 10) The north 3/4 mile of the line between Sections Nineteen and Twenty
- 11) The line between Sections Twenty-two and Twenty-seven
- 12) The line between Sections Twenty-three and Twenty-six
- 13) The line between Sections Twenty-four and Twenty-five
- 14) The east line of Section Twenty-four
- 15) The north 1/2 mile of the east line of Section Twenty-five
- 16) The line between Sections Twenty-five and Thirty-six
- 17) The line between Sections Twenty-six and Thirty-five
- 18) The line between Sections Twenty-seven and Thirty-four
- 19) The line between Sections Twenty-eight and Thirty-three

James Cheney, 93, a lifetime resident of the Rexford community, died Sunday, April 27, 2003, at the Logan County Hospital in Oakley.

He was born Dec. 23, 1909, in the Hawkeye community, north of Rexford, the son of Joseph Allen and Serena (Janssen) Cheney. He attended Fairview District School.

He married Lura Barnett on Feb. 2, 1941, at Gem and they made their home on the Cheney family farm. He was a member of the Rexford Community Church.

Survivors include a son, Larry Cheney, Goodland; a daughter, Carol and LeRoy Korte, Oxford; seven grandchildren; 15 great-grandchildren, and three step-great-grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by his wife; parents; step-father, John Merkel; two brothers, Carl and William Cheney, and a sister, Anna Barnett.

Wendell Thomas Frickey, 85, a native of Decatur County, died Saturday, April 26, 2003, at Hays Medical Center in Hays.

He was born Aug. 30, 1917, at the family farm near Kanona, the son of John and Elizabeth (Pauley) Frickey. He was reared in the Kanona area and attended school there.

He married Wanda Vivian Chandler on Aug. 20, 1938, in Norton. They moved to the Sand Hills of Nebraska where he fed cattle and shucked corn and his wife worked in their employer's home. They re-

turned to Decatur County to help with harvest during each summer.

He was drafted into the service in 1942, leaving his four-day-old son Wayne, and wife, two days before Christmas. He served as a Medical Air Force Technician and received his training at Fitzsimons Hospital in Denver.

After his discharge, the family moved to Wilsonville, Neb., where they built and operated a locker plant. Later they purchased a farm on the Sappa Creek in the Lyle Community, where they lived for over 20 years. They retired in 1970 and moved to Oberlin. His wife preceded him in death on May 23, 2002.

Survivors include two sons, Wayne and Donna Frickey, Rhome, Texas, and Willard and Jackie Frickey, Hays; seven grandchildren; 14 great-grandchildren; and his siblings, Norton and Zel Frickey, Denver; Harold Frickey, Oberlin, and Lela Huff, Broomfield, Colo.

He retired from business in 1994.
