at regionals in WaKeeney

Thirteen Decatur Community High athletes will be heading for the state track meet after qualifying at the regional meet at Trego Community High School in WaKeeney on Friday.

The Oberlin boys placed first at the meet with 74 points; followed by Leoti, 62; and St. Francis, 57. The Oberlin girls came in eighth with 28.5 points. First for the girls were Osborne, 91; Hoxie, second, 62; and Syracuse, third, 58.5.

Other schools in the competition were Trego Community, Stanton County, Ellis, Sublette, Plainville, Atwood, Satanta, Stockton and Hill Citv.

Six girls and seven boys jumped, ran and threw fast enough and far enough to make the cut by being in the top four finishers in their events.
