An eight-week health and fitness program, Walk Kansas, has been completed in Decatur County.

The fitness program, sponsored by Decatur County K-State Research and Extension, was open to adults, students and children 5 and older. Thirty-six Decatur County residents, six teams, participated in the program this first year.

The goal is to encourage 30 minutes or more of moderate-intensity aerobic exercise five or more days a week. Walking is encouraged because it is an exercise most people can do, and are encouraged to keep doing once the program is complete.

Miles or minutes of exercise were logged as teams tried to accumulate 423 miles to "walk" across Kansas.

Decatur County's teams were: Walk 'Til We Drop, Skinny Wannabees, S Miles 2 U, Mod Squad, Choc-a-holics, and the Calm Gals. Four teams walked all the way across Kansas and part way back, Walk 'Til We Drop, Skinny Wannabees, S Miles 2 U and the Mod Squad.

The team which turned in the most miles was Walk 'Til We Drop, with a combined total of 670 miles in eight weeks. Team members were Pat Brown (captain), Lenora Soderlund, Dori Pauls, Ruth Wolfram, Judy Ostmeier and Theresa Brown.
