Staff Sgt. Jacob Max Ward was raised in the Norton and Clayton area. He graduated from Norton Community High School in 1994 and attended Kansas State University for a year before enlisting in the U.S. Marine Corp in 1996. He graduated as a Private First Class on Nov. 1, 1996.

He is stationed at Ma-

rine Corp Recruit Depot in San Diego, where he fills the billet of senior drill instructor for Platoon 2071 in his second tour of duty.

On his second deployment to the Persian Gulf, he embarked aboard the USS Peleliu.

Prior to being stationed at the Marine Corp Recruit Depot, Sgt. Ward was data communications chief for the 5th Marine Regiment, 1st Marine Division, Camp Pendleton, Calif.

He completed training in Singapore while assigned to the 13th Marine Expeditionary Unit, then embarked aboard the USS Boxer in the Amphibious Ready Group as a tactical data networker. In January 1999, while deployed on the Boxer, his unit joined other battle units in Operation Desert Fox, during which U.S. forces attacked military targets in Iraq.
