Norcatur teen-ager takes first in rodeo

Chance Harman of Norcatur won first place in the Kansas State High School Rodeo, earning him a trip to the national competition in Farmington, N.M. Harman, who will be a senior this fall at Decatur Community High, took first in the saddle bronc competition at the state rodeo, which was held at Topeka on June 6-8. As a qualifier, Harman will go with the Kansas team to the 55th Annual National High School Fi-

nals Rodeo, which is held in Farmington from July 21-27. There will be more than 1,500 contestants from 39 states, five Canadian provinces and Australia at the finals. Contestants will compete for more than \$125,000 in prizes, plus \$150,000 in college scholarships. Harman is the son of Ron and Renee Harman and the grandson of Bob and Anita Montgomery.

Swim team takes fourth place in Oakley

The Oberlin swim team took fourth place at the Oakley Swim Meet on Saturday, with the swimmers setting 20 personal records in the Northwest Kansas League event.

"This is probably the best our team has done in a long time," said Susan Nelson, club vice president. "They usually take fifth or sixth." Colby took first; Holyoke, Colo., second; and Burlington, Colo., third.
