Dennis Lee Winget

Dennis Lee Winget, 74, died July 9, 2003, at Northwestern Hospital, Chicago.

He was born May 25, 1929, in Decatur County, the son of Walter Calvin and Anna May Kincaid Winget. He lived in Jennings and Stockton, where he received his early education, before joining the Air Force during the Korean War. He was stationed in the Panama Canal Zone.

He attended Kansas State University, graduating with a bachelor's degree in geology. He worked for Mobil Oil in Venezuela, West Africa, Paris and Libya. After leaving Mobil he attended Columbia University, receiving his master's in business administration.

On April 7, 1963, he married Cecily Muir in Oakley.

He then worked for W.R. Grace oil interests in Libya and Thomas McKinnon on Wall Street in New York as an oil securities analyst. He joined the Continental Bank in Chicago as a vice president in the commercial division and later transferred to the Penn Square Bank, Oklahoma City, as a senior vice president.

His last job was with the Federal Deposit Insurance Corp. in Chicago. After retirement, the Wingets traveled between South Africa and Chicago.

He was a member of the American Association of Petroleum Geologists, the Society of Petroleum Engineers, Beta Theta Pi fraternity and a Gold Card member of the Scottsville Racetrack in South Africa.

He is survived by his wife, of the home; a son Mark Winget, Chicago; a daughter, Patricia Alberts, Johannesburg, South Africa; a brother, William Winget, Aurora, Colo.; and three grandchildren. His parents preceded him in death.

The funeral was to be Tuesday at the Kennedy-Koster Funeral Home, Oakley, with Pastor Mike Eurit officiating. Burial was to be in the Jennings Cemetery with military graveside rites by the U.S. Army out of Fort Riley.

Man accused of intimidation

Officers arrested Jerry Farr, 43, about 5:35 p.m. Friday evening for aggravated intimidation of a wit-

ness. Mr. Farr was arrested about three weeks ago when a call came in that there was a fight in the 100 block of N. Elk. He was charged with misdemeanor battery at the time.

Friday, officers said that the man allegedly tried to intimidate a 17-year-old. To intimidate a witness means to harass or threaten, said Patrolman Scott Ziegler.

While the first charge was a misdemeanor, the new one is a felony. Mr. Farr was still in jail on a \$50,000 bond on Monday.

Masons support cancer unit

The Kansas Masonic Foundation's support at the Kansas Cancer Institute at the University of Kansas Medical Center reached a major milestone recently as donations surpassed the \$5 million mark.

The foundation has been a major contributor for almost 30 years, and according to Dr. William R. Jewell, professor of surgery and the Director, the impact of the Masons' donation is even more significant.

"By the financial aid from the Masons, we have been able to estab-

lish a number of programs, which can then qualify for a variety of government grants. Their financial aid has been a driving force behind several elements of our cancer research," Dr. Jewell said.

Mark Nelson, a Past Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Kansas, serves as the executive director of the Kansas Masonic Foundation. He said the support helps the Masonic commitment to serving their fellow man.

Dr. Jewell said the money has

supported a variety of research programs including groundbreaking research in breast and prostate cancers. An outreach program for cancer awareness and screenings is also planned in the state. Six sites have been chosen to host one-day programs that will include cancer and smoking cessation information, as well as screenings for various types of cancer.

"These programs will be held in Masonic lodges, but will be free and open to the public," he said.
