

# Six swimmers take honors at Northwest Kansas League

Oberlin had six swimmers to take high-point honors at the Northwest Kansas League meet in Burlington, Colo., on Friday and Saturday.

Taking honors were Saeger Grafel, 9, sixth place; Jordan Dreher, 10, sixth; Leanna Sheaffer, 13, fourth; Heather Glodt, 13, first; Molly Coleman, 16, second; and Matt Coleman, 17, third.

Glodt swam a perfect season, taking first place in every race and setting pool records including a new 50-yard freestyle record in the league meet.

Oberlin swimming coaches Allie Moore and Molly Coleman said they were pleased with the fifth place the team took at the meet.

"Everyone swam to personal bests throughout the season," Molly said, "and really stepped up to the block, earning a record 38 personal bests at the league meet."
