Train became popular attraction at county carnival

Strasburg, Colo., who builds trains. However, after checking the cost, they knew that adding one would probably be impossible.

"However," Mr. Lotker said, "one day I was walking down the street and Dwight Wenger, who had an electrical shop, stopped me and said, 'What would you say if I told you I knew of someone who would buy you a train?'

"I was taken back about like I was when Ward called me up and asked if he could buy a merrygo-round."

Mr. Lotker said that several days later, he was in Dwight's shop and Harry Schrammel, who was working for Dwight part-time, walked over and said, "I'll buy you the train."

After he told the board of Mr. Schrammel's generous offer, they and Mr. Schrammel went to Strasburg to check on a train. The owner, Marvin Uhrich, showed the group blueprints of a steam engine, but said that he felt what was needed for Oberlin was one with a gasolinepowered engine.

By mid-afternoon, the contract had been drawn up and signed to be delivered to Mr.

Although Mr. Schrammel agreed to buy the train, he said it was up to the Amusement Authority to furnish the track and the railroad, so that put another project on the authority's agenda, Mr. Lotker said.

"Building the track was quite an interesting undertaking for volunteers," Mr. Lotker said. "Then the next project was building a station."

After it was completed, plans were made for the dedication and Gov. John Carlin was invited.

Ken Rydquist served as master of ceremonies. Sharon Kessinger, co-publisher of The Oberlin Herald, who had gone to Hydro, Okla., with the board and wrote all of the articles and took pictures to promote the carnival in its early stages, was also an invited guest.

Machinist Charles Springs, who spent many hours working on the train parts, said one of his prize pieces was the brass bell and decorative brass light fixtures which were mounted on the locomotive.

Highlighting the Decatur County Fair opener on Tuesday evening in 1980 was the dedication of the authentic scale locomotive and cars donated by Harry and Betty Schrammel. Gov. Carlin drove a golden spike as part of the official ceremony.

Throughout the years, the train has been one of the most popular rides at the fair.

Stuart Euhus, one of the first Amusement Authority board members, summed up all of the effort that went into the carnival this way:

"Our home-grown carnival would possibly be the ultimate in community cooperation. It took a great deal of effort on the part of those who had an interest in seeing it succeed.

"A commitment to make it work was there, too. It didn't always come together easy or as planned, but with hard work and lots of research, it finally came to completion...

"Now, we look at the carnival as part of the Decatur County Fair every year, offering local people a chance to go to a good, clean, well-run carnival, as well as out-of-town people who come and bring their families and have a great time...."
