Building permits totaling over \$100,000 have been issued by the City of Oberlin since March 1.

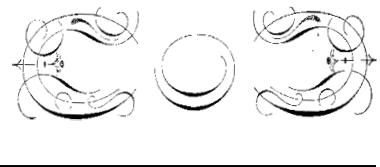
