Early is right. The young Red Devils outscored Oakley 25-4 in the first quarter and 12-2 in the second to lead 37-6 at the half.


In the third quarter, Oberlin scored 9 points to Oakley's 2 and only in the third quarter did the home team outscore the Devils, 2-0.
