## New centerpiece for Kuska museum

The grand opening of the Kuska Galleries on Sunday at the Prairie Museum of Art and History, 1905 S. Franklin, in Colby, featured kids' crafts, Museum Mart discounts and free admission.

Centerpiece of the new galleries is the extensive doll collection of Nellie Kuska, a long-time Colby resident, which was left to the museum.

Nellie McVey Kuska was born in 1887 in Hill City, and when she was


seven years old she received a bisque doll, made in 1887, as a reward for learning her multiplication tables. This was the beginning of a lifetime of collecting.

Joseph B. Kuska was born in 1890 in Milligan, Neb., and moved to Colby in 1913 as an agronomist for the Colby Branch Experiment Station of Kansas State University. In 1917, he married Nellie and they had three sons: Norman, Milton and George, all graduates of Colby High

School and the University of Nebraska.

When the family lived in Colby, her collection filled her house and she often gave tours.

In 1957, the couple moved to California to be near their sons and their families. They opened the Kuska Museum near their home in Lomita, Calif. The Kuska Foundation donated their collection to the people of Thomas County in 1975.
