Seventh graders win 56-28

Eighth grade falls 43-32 to Hoxie boys

The Decatur Community High seventh-grade boys basketball team downed Hoxie on Thursday 56-28 but the eighth-graders lost 43-32.

"The boys played a tremendous team game," Coach Tim Breth said of the seventh-grade game. "We shot 37 percent for the game."

The stands were full of excited parents as the boys rang up basket after basket in the Oberlin junior high gym.

Oberlin jumped out ahead, and except for one quarter when each team scored 16, they outscored the Hoxie boys in every time period.


The score was 15-6 at the end of the first quarter, then both teams scored 16 in the second quarter, giving Oberlin a 31-22 lead at the half. Oberlin outscored Hoxie 10-5 in the third quarter, and 15-1 in the last.

The win brought the seventhgraders' record to 3-1. They were to play in Atwood on Monday.

Scoring were Logan Fortin, 22 points, nine rebounds and four steals; Sam Stapp, 19 points and 14 rebounds; Luke Juenemann, 8 points and 11 rebounds; Jordan Tally, 4 points; Cole May, 2; and Jacob Fortin, 1.

The eighth-graders stayed mostly even with Hoxie except for the second quarter.

"We had a miserable second quarter that we could never recover from," Coach Breth said. "An inspired second half wasn't enough."
