

# Red Devil basketball boys lose to Plainsmen 65-55

The Decatur Community High boys lost their first basketball game of the season to the Plainsmen in Oakley on Friday.

The contest was close until the end, but Oakley overcame the Red Devils 65-55.

In the first quarter, the Devils edged the Plainsmen 11-10, but Oakley got hot in the second, outscoring Oberlin 14-7. They led 24-18 at the half.

Oberlin's turn to get hot came in the third quarter and the Devils put up 20 points to the home team's 15, but still trailed 39-38 after three. The fourth quarter was Oakley's, though, as they outscored the Devils 23-17 for the win.

"Our defense was not very good," Coach Dick Ahlberg said. "We did not contest the three-point ball very well, and we had too many turnovers."

Oberlin suffered 22 turnovers to Oakley's 10, but out rebounded the Plainsmen 34-25.

Scoring for the Red Devils were Egan Grafel, 32 points; Matt Mondero, 6; Chase Juenemann, 5; Jesse Juenemann, 4; Lance Fortin and Chase McKittrick, 3 each; and Jason Thomas, 2.

Leading rebounders were Grafel with 16, followed by Mondero and Fortin, five each; C. Juenemann and

McKittrick, three each; J. Juenemann, two; and Andy Anderson, one.

Grafel was the assist leader with seven, followed by Fortin, McKittrick and Mondero, three each, and C. Juenemann and J. Juenemann, one each.

Fortin and C. Juenemann each had a pair of steals.

The Red Devils will be in the Sagebrush Shootout this week in Brewster. The games were to start on Tuesday, with Oberlin facing the Grinnell Warriors in the opening contest. The tournament will continue on Friday and Saturday.

# Basketball girls lose 61-50

The Decatur Community High girls lost 61-50 to the Oakley Plainswomen on Friday.

Oberlin led at the beginning of the game 15-11, and the score was tied at 26 at halftime. At the end of three, Oberlin was still ahead by a point, 34-33, but the Plainswomen had a big fourth quarter, hitting 14 out of 19 trips to the free-throw line. Oberlin also was good at the line, hitting seven of nine, but they couldn't overcome the red-hot Oakley squad.

"It was a tough loss to start the season," Coach Paul Nepodal said. "I though we played well enough to win, but some key mistakes here and there cost us. This game gives us something work on as we get going."

Scoring were Abby Ream, 15; Kelsey Dorshorst and Jamie Elwood, 11 each; Lydia Karnopp, 6;

Rena Unger, 3; and Lauren Fortin and Kerrie Olson, 2 each.

Top rebounders were Dorshorst with eight and Karnopp and Elwood with four each.

The junior varsity squad fell 30-24.

Unlike the varsity, the younger girls got behind in the first quarter and were never able to catch up. Oakley was ahead at the quarters, 10-7, 16-10, 20-16 and 30-24.

Scoring were Fortin and Heather Williams, 6 each; Kaitlyn Stapp and Tricia Dorshorst, 4 each; and

Christa Hardy and Sarah Murray, 2 each.

The freshmen teams played half a game. Oakley outscored Oberlin 15-10 in the first quarter and 21-14 at the end of two.

Scoring were Williams, 7; Hardy, 5; and Murray, 2.

The junior varsity and freshmen will have the week off while the varsity travels to Brewster for the annual Sagebrush Shootout. The Oberlin girls were scheduled to play Grinnell for their opening contest at 3 p.m. Tuesday.

needs to realize that if the city gets the grant it would help keep sewer rates down.

The city wouldn't find out about the grant until January 2005.

Mayor Ken Shobe asked what the city has to do for the survey.

Mr. Shike said a qualified person would have to be hired to administer it and the Northwest Kansas Planning and Development Commission would let us know what has to be asked.

Councilman Patrick Pomeroy asked what the cost would be. Mayor Shobe said if the grant is awarded the savings will be great.

Councilman Stan McEvoy agreed that they need to look into the grant.

He said he would like to see the city then go for the 20 year loan, instead of 40 years.

Mr. Pomeroy disagreed, saying he has been crunching the numbers and thinks the 40 year plan is better for the users and for the city.

If the 300,000-gallon-a-day plant is only going to save 10 percent, but the 450,000 gallon a day plant is 50 percent larger, he said it makes sense to go with the larger one.

The council didn't make any decisions, but decided to call a special meeting for the public meeting, after which they may make a decision on the size and the financing.

The meeting is open and the council has encouraged everyone to attend. It will be held at 6:30 p.m. Thursday at The Gateway.
