# Oberlin Junior High boys lose

The Decatur Community Junior High boys lost to Goodland in both the seventh- and eighth-grade games on Thursday in Goodland.

The seventh-graders fell 38-29. "We came out the first half very flat and shot poorly," Coach Tim Breth said. "We made a run at them in the fourth quarter, but it wasn't enough."

The Goodland boys took the lead in the first quarter and never gave it up, outscoring Oberlin 12-9, 7-2 and 11-6 in the first three quarters to lead 30-17. In the fourth quarter, the young Devils came alive and put up 12 points to Goodland's 8, but it was

too late.

The seventh-graders now have a 3-3 record.

Scoring for the Devils were Logan Fortin, 14 points and five rebounds; Luke Juenemann, 6 points and three steals; Jordan Tally, 3 points and two rebounds; Everett Urban, 3 points; Jacob Fortin, 2; and Kevin Farr, 1 point and four rebounds.

The eighth-graders only played half a game, and it was a rough one.

They were outscored 30-3 in the first quarter and 20-2 in the second to lose the game 50-5.

The eighth graders now have a 1-5 record.
