The Decatur Community High boys basketball team took its record to 5-1 and picked up its first league victory with wins over Hill City, 59-56, and St. Francis, 71-32, last week.

On Tuesday, the Red Devils were in Hill City for a tight game with the Ringnecks. Oberlin won 59-56.

Although the Oberlin boys started off hot, outscoring the Ringnecks 18-12 in the first quarter, they didn't maintain their momentum in the second quarter, when both teams scored 11 points. Still, Oberlin led 29-23 at the half.

The third quarter was a good one as the Red Devils outscored the home team 18-15 to take a 47-36 lead. In the fourth quarter, however, the Devils nearly gave the game away as they missed free throws, sinking only three of 12 and scoring only a dozen points while the Ringnecks put in 11 out of 14 at the charity line and were able to score 18.
