Devil boys win five, lose one in first half

Oberlin beats three in tourney, Sainty, Hill City

The Decatur Community High boys basketball squad finished the The Salina Journal. first part of its season with a 5-1 record.

Before Christmas, the Red Devils lost to Oakley in their opener then won the Sagebrush Shootout in Plains and Brewster in the championships.

Then they beat Hill City and St. Francis in the last games of 2003. The win over the Sainty Indians gave the Red Devils a Northwest Kansas League record of 1-0.

The Oberlin junior varsity and the freshman team are both 2-1.

Senior Egan Grafel leads the varsity team in scoring with 28.8 points per game.

Following Grafel are senior Matt Mondero with 13.3, junior Lance Fortin at 9.5 and senior Chase McKittrick, 6.5.

Grafel also leads in rebounding Brewster, beating Grinnell, Golden with 13.8 per game, followed by Mondero, 8.2; Fortin, 4.5; and sophomore Jesse Juenemann, 3.

Mondero has a small edge, 4.3 to 4.2, over Grafel in assists. Other assist leaders are McKittrick, 2.3; Juenemann, 2.2; and Fortin, 2.

McKittrick led in three-point shots with a 53.3 percent average. Fortin was second with 27.3 and Juenemann third at 25 percent.

Grafel led in two-point hits with 65.4 percent, followed by Mondero, home on Tuesday against Norton, 60.3: and Fortin, 51.6.

In the first quarter, the Coyotes jumped out to a 16-10 lead as Miller found the basket for 10 points.

In the second quarter, it was the Bulldogs' turn to howl, as the home team outscored Jennings 24-12, hitting eight out of 10 at the charity line.

At the half, it was Golden Plains 34-28, but the third and fourth quarters belonged A. Wahlmeier, one. to the Coyotes.
