The Coyotes started out with a moderate lead, but by the end of the game had almost shut down the visitors.

In the first quarter, the Coyotes took a 13-11 lead over the Cougars. In the second, they outscored the boys from Bird City 18-14 for a 31-25 lead at the half.

In the third quarter, scoring was low with Jennings hitting 8 points and Cheylin 5 to strengthen the home teams' lead to 39-30.

The last quarter was the killer for the Cougars. Jennings scored 18 points as six

players put balls into the basket. Cheylin had only two players able to score and they came up with just 8 points.

Scoring for Jennings were Brett McKenna, 18; Grant Bailey, 13; Marcus McKenna, 11 including 3 three-pointers; Adam Wahlmeier, 5; Kyle Kinser, 4; and Nick Wahlmeier, Andy Coiner and Brian Miller, 2 each.

In junior varsity play the Coyotes edged the Cougars 51-47.

The Coyotes took the lead in the first quarter 13-12 and were able to hold on at the end of the half with a 30-26 edge. At the end of three, however, the Cougars were ahead 42-36 after a 16-6 third quarter.

The Coyotes turned the tables in the fourth quarter, outscoring Bird City 15-5 for the win.

The third quarter was more of the same with Osborne outscoring Oberlin 16-8. Only in the fourth quarter was Oberlin able to put up more points than Osborne, 8-6.

In the second round Oberlin did much better against Plainville although they still lost 50-44.
