## Boys place third at tournament

The Red Devils took third place in the Oberlin Invitational Basketball Tournament held last week at Decatur Community High School.

The boys started on Thursday night when they met Resurrection Christian School from Colorado. The boys downed the Colorado team 66-29 scoring 12 points in the first period, 29 in the second, 15 in the third and 10 in the fourth.

Scoring for Oberlin were: Egan Grafel, 25; Lance Fortin, 23; Matt Mondero, 8; Andy Anderson, 4; Jason Thomas, 2.

The Colorado team scored 6 in the first period, 6 in the second, 9 in the third and 8 in the fourth.

"We took care of business tonight," said Coach Dick Ahlberg. "Lance played well tonight and Matt passed the ball well. Our defenses showed improvement."

On Friday the Red Devils met Cambridge and lost 72-55.

Coach Ahlberg said Cambridge outplayed the team with more rebounds, better shooting and fewer turnovers.

Oberlin scored 7 points in the first period; 12 in the second, 16 in the third and 20 in the fourth. Cam-

bridge scored 18 in the first; 19 in the second, 16 in the third, and 19 in the fourth.

Scoring for Oberlin were: Egan Grafel, 25; Fortin, 14 points; Mondero, 7; Chase McKittrick, 5; Jesse Juenemann, 2; and Anderson, 1.

With a loss, that meant the Red Devils would meet Hoxie on Saturday playing for third place. Oberlin won the game 72-46 outscoring the Hoxie team in every period.

Oberlin scored 14 points in the first; 17 in the second; 23 in the third, and 18 in the fourth. Hoxie scored 12, first; 13, second; 10, third, and 11 in the fourth.

Scoring for the Devils were: Grafel 27; Fortin, 21; Mondero, 14; Anderson, Juenemann, 4; Juene-mann, McKittrick and Inman 2.

"This was a very competitive tournament," said Coach Ahlberg. "Thanks to the staff and friends for all their support."

He said Egan Grafel and Fortin were named to the all tournament team, Anderson to the all academic and Inman won the free throw contest.

The boys will meet the Goodland Cowboys at home on Friday.
