

Oberlin junior varsity beats Norton, falls to Hoxie

The Decatur Community High junior varsity girls came from behind to beat Norton 30-28 last Tuesday but fell 48-29 in Hoxie on Friday.

The Oberlin girls started out behind 13-8 in the first quarter at Norton, then each team scored 6 in the second to put the Lady Jays up 19-14 at the half.

In the third quarter Oberlin scored 2 and Norton 5 points to take a 24-16 lead at the end of three. In the fourth quarter, the Devils outscored the Jays 14-4.

Scoring were Tricia Dorshorst, 12; Christa Hardy, 7; Whitnee Ashley, 4; Heather Williams, 3; and Lauren Fortin and Sarah Murray, 2 each.

Williams was the rebound

leader with four, followed by Dorshorst with three. Hardy had five steals.

On Friday, the girls were in Hoxie but they didn't have a spectacular fourth quarter to push them ahead.

In the first quarter, they were outscored by the Indians 18-4 and in the second 11-7, so that by the half Hoxie had a 29-11 lead. In the third quarter, both teams scored 8 and in the fourth Hoxie outscored the Devils 11-10.

Scoring for Oberlin were Williams, 12; Dorshorst, 6; Hardy, 4; Ashley, 3; and Sarah Murray and Megan Barrett, 2 each. Dorshorst was the top rebounder with 10, followed by Williams with seven. Hardy had seven steals.

As they prepared to play their last home basketball game, the Herndon High Beavers took their record to 18-1 with victories over Northern Valley, Triplains and Kensington.

On Friday, the Beavers took on the Northern Valley Huskies from Almena and sent the doggies home with a 82-45 loss.

Herndon jumped out to a big 21-7 lead in the first quarter and never let up, outscoring the visitors 19-13 in the second, 22-13 in the third and 20-12 in the final quarter.

Herndon's attack included five players in double figures. Scoring were Brett Chambers, 19; Curtis Brown, 17; Jeff Riener, 13; Lance Basgall and Daron Chambers, 10 each; Abe Marintzer, 8; Ben Grafel,

3; and Brett Sagel, 2.

On Feb. 10, the Beavers downed the Triplains Vikings 86-39 in Herndon.

The boys from Winona had no more chance than those from Almena, as the Beavers took a 32-10 lead in the first quarter and outscored the visitors 13-6, 21-8 and 20-15 in the last three.

"We shot a season high of 67 percent from the floor," Coach Ryan Becker said. "Brett Chambers was the man with the hot hands. He scored 22 points and was six for seven from three-point land."

Also scoring were Marintzer, 21; Brown, 16; Grafel, 8; D. Chambers, 7; and Basgall and J. Reiner, 6 each. Brown had 11 rebounds.

On Feb. 9, the Beavers were on the road to squash the Goldbugs in Kensington 63-58. While later the Beavers dealt easily with Triplains and Northern Valley, Kensington put up a fight.

The Goldbugs led at the end of the first quarter 16-13 and, although Herndon outscored them 10-8 in the second, the Bugs held a 24-23 lead at the half.

In the second half, both teams had good scoring but Herndon's was just a little better. The Beavers outscored the Goldbugs 22-18 in the third quarter and 18-16 in the fourth for the 5-point victory.

"We found a different way to win last night," Coach Becker said. "Some other (bench) players

stepped up and contributed in a big way.

"Our outside shooting was huge. We shot eight of 21 from the three-point line and 60 percent from two. We were able to make big shots when needed. It is always a battle with Kensington, and last night was no exception.

"I'm proud of how we handled a tough situation and kept our heads as a team."

Scoring were Marintzer, 19; Basgall, 17; B. Chambers, 11; D. Chambers, 8; Brown, 6; and J. Riener, 2.

The last home game will be at 5:30 p.m. Friday against the Palco Roosters.

Eighth-grade 'B' team wins two games

Even though the Decatur Community Junior High eighth-grade varsity girls basketball team hasn't won a game, the B team won two at a tournament in Hoxie on Saturday.

The eighth-graders have had a bad year, losing to Goodland, Atwood, Hoxie, Colby and Oakley before going to Quinter for a B-team tournament on Saturday.

Colby jumped out to an early 13-6 lead in the first quarter and never gave up.

Oakley outscored Oberlin in all but the third quarter, the only period the young Devils scored more than a single basket. In the third, Oberlin outscored Oakley 6-3.

Scoring were Ream, 4; and Ortiz, Glodt, Dellere and Sheaffer, 2 each. On Saturday, the B team had bet-

ter luck as they downed Oakley, 32-6, and Atwood, 28-11.

The Oakley girls scored a free throw in the first quarter, a three-point basket in the second and a two-point basket in the fourth quarter while Oberlin scored 9, 6, 8 and 7 in the four quarters.

Scoring were Wendelin, 10; Kassia Bryan, 7; Kayla Zodrow, 6; Jessica Bovee, 5; and Ortiz and Alyssa Montgomery, 2 each.

Atwood also was unable to score against the Oberlin girls. The young Devils outscored them in every quarter, 6-4, 9-4, 5-0 and 8-3.
