Survivors include her husband, Myron, Norton; three children, Arloa Kay and Joe Barnes, Smith Center; Tona Leigh and Ron Leiker, Andover; and Darron Douglas and Dawn Veh, Hutchinson; seven grandchildren, and one sister, Celia Dee Wolfe, Norton.

She was preceded in death by her grandparents, her parents, and one brother-in-law, Roger Wolfe.
