

Ross Van Pelt

Ross Van Pelt, 75, a retired farmer and World War II veteran, died Sunday, June 20, 2004, at the Decatur County Hospital in Oberlin.

He was born Aug. 16, 1928, in Kansas City, Mo., the son of Will and Myrtle (Fowler) Van Pelt. He was reared on a farm in Decatur County and attended country school. He graduated from Decatur Community High School in 1946. He served in the U.S. Army during World War II, where he was a cor-

He married Dorothy Ann Ruby on Tally, Oberlin; and eight grandchil-Sept. 26, 1948, at Danbury. They lived at Danbury until 1949, when they moved to a farm northeast of Oberlin. 
