not in word or speech, but in truth and action." That sounds so simple, but as we look at the world we can see that most often. love is not demonstrated in truth and action, but defined for us by slogans and slick commercials. We are told that love is made easier with a beautiful piece of diamond jewelry or with a trip to a faraway locale. Or even that love is demonstrated by the clothes one wears or the kind of car one drives. Words and speech, but very little truth and action.

When you read the "love" chapter from 1 Corinthians 13, the scripture most often read at weddings, we hear from Paul that love is indeed act that demonstrates love to another. We typically

In 1 John 3:18 it says, "Little children, let us love, think of that scripture as applying only to married couples, but I believe that Paul was speaking to the whole family of God when he wrote those words. If we want to love another in truth and action, then we must be patient and kind, not jealous or proud, or insisting on our own way, not irritable or resentful and always rejoicing in the truth.

But more than that, love shows itself most clearly when we do for others, not because it is required, not because we are forced, but because our heart tells us that it is the right thing to do. Yes indeed, love is not words and speech, but truth and action.
