

Oberlin swimmers place at league meet in Wray

The Oberlin swim team ended its season at the league meet, with three swimmers placing and an Oberlin girl finishing with the highest point total at the two-day meet.

Heather Glodt took first in points at the meet, held July 9 and 10 at the new \$1.4 million aquatic center in Wray, Colo.

Glodt took third place in points for the season among girls ages 13-14. She has taken first in every race she has been in this year but was unable to attend a couple of meets.

Tyler Shields was fourth among boys age 9-10, while Ashley Horton took sixth among girls age 11-12.

This was the last meet for Allie Moore, who has swum for 12 years, and Matt Coleman, who has swum for six, as both graduated from high school this year and will be too old to compete next season.

Oberlin sent 22 swimmers to the league meet. They took part in 38 races.
