County Executive Director Diane Barrett of the Farm Service Agency in Oberlin said there will not be a final 2003 counter-cyclical payment for these crops because the effective prices exceed their respective target prices. Farmers could receive advance payments in October and February under the program, she said.

They also received advance payments for corn and milo in October 2003. If the final effective market price for any of these commodities

vance counter-cyclical payments on required to refund any unearned counter-cyclical payments for these crops as well, she said.

Counter-cyclical payments serve as a safety net for farmers, helping make up the difference between production costs and low market prices. Whether overpayments exist is not known until after the end of each crop's 12-month marketing year.

Affected farmers have two options for refunding unearned payments. The default will be to reduce any direct cyclical payments received between October and March to satisfy the obligation. The second allows farmers to write a check to Commodity Credit Corp. for the unearned payments.
