

Swimmers take medals at meet

Two Oberlin girls took medals in the Missouri Valley Swim League Division II Championship meet in Manhattan on July 23-25. Heather Glodt took a second place and Molly Coleman a third, fourth, sixth and eighth at the meet. Glodt placed second in the girls age 13-14 group in the 100-meter freestyle with a time of 1 minute, 10.4 seconds. She established Division II meet qualifying times in the 100-meter backstroke, 1:30.41; 200-meter backstroke, 3:17.08; 100-meter butterfly, 1:25.17; 200-meter butterfly, 3:37.83; 200-meter individual medley, 3:07.9; and 400-meter indi-

vidual medley, 6:54.7. Coleman, in the 15 and older group, took third place in the 50-meter freestyle in 32.14; fourth in the breaststroke, 1:36.51; sixth in the 100-meter backstroke, 1:26.7; and eighth in the 200-meter backstroke, 3:06.97. She had a qualifying time in the 200-meter individual medley, 3:03.94; and swam in the 100-meter butterfly, 1:30.32. Swimmers must maintain qualifying times in order to continue to swim in the division. Those with the fastest times can advance to Division I.

Cowboy wins fourth

A May graduate of Decatur Community High School took fourth at nationals for saddle bronc riding. For the last week, Chance Harman and family stayed in Gillette, Wyo., where he competed

against 129 other riders in the saddle bronc competition. With him from Decatur County was Jamie Elwood. She competed in break away, but didn't place.
