# Pilot kept in a coma for healing

Dennis Kasson, a Norton County farmer-stockman and part-time pilot injured in a plane crash last month, remains in a drug-induced coma at Via Christi/St. Francis Medical Center in Wichita while recovering from burns.

Mr. Kasson suffered third-degree burns over 60 percent of his body in the crash July 15.

His wife Sandy, who has been by her husband's side since the accident, returned to their home last Monday, planning to return to Wichita on Wednesday. Mrs. Kasson said her husband is in the intensive care unit and has had some skin grafts. She said he will be having more over the next month or so.

Mrs. Kasson said the doctors have told her to expect him to be in the hospital for at least two months.

We've been here for 23 days, so we're looking at one more month, maybe six weeks," she said.

Mrs. Kasson said the doctors are planning to gradually reduce the drugs that are keeping her husband in a coma over the next week.

The Kassons' son Matt and his wife, the former Jenny Brown, are taking care of things for his parents while his father recovers.






