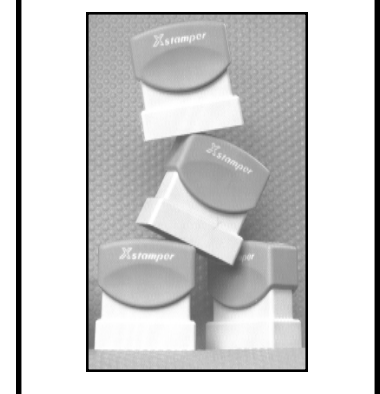
The Re-Load, in downtown Oberlin, is open at 11 a.m. and they close the grill around 9:30 to 10 p.m. Monday through Saturday.
