Changes made in handbook

Some changes have been made in the 2004-'05 Decatur Community Junior/Senior High School Student Handbook that students, parents, and teachers need to be aware of.

One of the changes deals with attendance and absences. The handbook now states, "When a student returns from an absence where the office does not have parental permission or acknowledgment, the absence will be unexcused. If the student says the parent knew, but the student forgot the note, the student will have until the next day by 8:20 to have the parent verify the absence as excused."

Changes have been made to the handbook because of issues or problems that have occurred during the past few years.

Another change deals with incomplete homework. The handbook states that a student will be assigned a penalty period for "failure to complete homework on time."

Students will also be given a penalty period after three tardies and all successive tardiness each semester.

Library pass rules have become stricter. To go to the library during homeroom or study hall, the student must have a pass from the teacher who gave the assignment the student needs to work on.

The SIT team is also explained in the new handbook. SIT stands for Student Improvement Team, and it consists of teachers "who are willing to help students to establish goals and strategies to help them overcome personal, academic and behavior concerns.'

New graduation requirement changes have been made that will apply to the class of 2009, this year's 8th graders. (See separate story in the Dictator.)

Senior Kelsey Gallentine said, "I'm glad I am a senior and don't have to go through the new graduation requirements."

Cafeteria charging procedures have also been changed slightly. The school is now allowing only three meals to be charged to a student's account.

"Indiscreet low cut pants" has been added to unacceptable clothing in the dress code.

One more change concerns the Junior-Senior Prom and Homecoming candidates. The handbook now states that students who are nominated as candidates will be removed from that privilege and honor if at any time after nomination and before the coronation they violate the guidelines established by the Decatur Community High School training rules contract. If a student has violated the training contract and is removed from activities at the time of the nominations, they will not be considered as a candidate

Junior Nikki Lincoln said, "I think that the handbook changes are good and will help the students suc-

Oberlin was represented by all seven cheerleaders and their new sponsor, Gina Montgomery.


"I thought it was neat," said Mrs. Montgomery.
