

Time to test gauges on pressure canners

year, now is the time to have presmethod for the type of food, too sure canner dial gauges tested to be—short processing time, no processing sure they are accurate.

It's important to test dial gauges so that acid foods are properly processed to prevent bacterial growth from organisms such as clostridium botulinum, the pathogen that causes botulism, which can be fatal.

Pressure canners use either a dial gauge or a weighted gauge. Weighted gauges do not require testing. Dial gauges can be tested using testing units which are found in most K-State Research and Extension Offices

The U.S. Department of Agriculture Complete Guide to Home Canning recommends that consumer gauges which test one or more pounds high or low should be replaced for safety purposes. High readings will lead to under-processed, unsafe food. Until the gauge is replaced, adjust the recipe pressure for safety.

Are Old Canning Recipes Safe?

Many people have canning recipes that are passed down from generation to generation. However, with current research, many of those recipes have been found to be unsafe. This may be because of im-

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
