Both the boys and girls teams took fifth in the league and the Colby runners came in first for both.

Teryn Grafel was the first Oberlin runner across the line in the boys race, finishing the course in 19 minutes, 47 seconds for 18th. After him were Andy Leitner, 25th, 20:33; Kellen Doeden, 28th, 20:54; Aaron Helm, 30th, 21:24; Zeke Ruzicka, 33rd, 22:22; Brent Stallman, 35th, 23:28; and Scott Miller, 37th, 25:20.

"Our guys actually had a pretty good day," Coach Dick Ahlberg. "Teryn ran better, we had Andy back in the lineup, Kellen continued to give us a great effort and Aaron had a much better start today."

Becky Helm, who has won several medals this year, ran first for Oberlin at 15th in 13:56, not good enough to medal in the league meet.
