(Continued from Page 1A) a disability, there is a table where people can vote, if needed. If they can hear but not see, they send them into the coffee room so someone can read the ballot for them. Basically, she said, one of the workers can help the person or a family member can do it. Mrs. Horn said at the retirement homes, there is a helper who is a Republican and a helper who is a Democrat to assist the residents.

The county, said Mrs. Horn, is going to need at least four polling places at Oberlin, Norcatur, Dresden and Jennings. The cost isn't known yet.

Voters coming out on Tuesday to cast their ballots will use pencil and paper and go to their normal polling place. The polls will be open from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.

The polling places are:

• Allison, Pleasant Valley and Jennings townships and City of Jennings vote at the Jennings Senior Center.

• Altory, Center, Grant, Harlan, Liberty, Logan, Olive, Roosevelt and Sherman townships, at the Oberlin Golden Age Center.


• Bassettville, Beaver, Cook, Finley, Oberlin, Prairie Dog, Sappa and Summit townships, at the Oberlin American Legion.


