The Decatur Community Junior High football team lost to the Goodland Mustangs on Oct. 7 and to the Colby Eagles on Oct. 14.

The young Red Devils went to Goodland for their game against the Mustangs and came home with a 10-0 loss.

"Defensively, the team did a good job of team tackling, holding Goodland to only two first downs,' Coach Caleb Howland said. "Offensively, we could not catch a break and we were unable to capitalize on the scoring opportunities we did have.'

Oberlin had 132 yards on 33 carries rushing. Rushers were Lucas Juenemann, 123 yards on 18 carries; Sam Stapp, 13 yards on eight carries; Logan Fortin, eight yards on four; Clay Anderson, minus five yards on two; and Jacob Fortin, minus seven on one.

L. Fortin was two for eight through the air for seven yards and three interceptions, and Juenemann tried one pass, which was intercepted. Toby Peters grabbed one Fortin toss for six yards and Juenemann grabbed another for a yard. Oberlin had five first downs, six turnovers and lost 55 yards on six penalties. The Mustangs also won the fifthquarter play 6-0. "The young men on our fifthquarter team continue to play well as a team," Coach Howland said. "Wiley Farr and Clay Anderson had some good runs around the outside. There has been steady improvement from the offensive line with blocking assignments, and defensively, the team continues to improve every outing.' On Thursday, the junior high boys were in Colby, but the young Eagles downed the Red Devils 42-8. "Colby has a very good eighthgrade team," Coach Howland said. "Our defense was unable to stop their offense in the first half, as Colby scored 36 points. "The second half started with Colby returning the kickoff for another touchdown. I was impressed with our team's positive attitude as they continued to work hard the second half to finally score on the last play of the game. "Sam Stapp scored the touchdown and Toby Peters caught the Hill City, fifth, 108; and Hoxie, pass from Logan Fortin for the twopoint conversion. "The team finished the season with a record of two wins and five losses." The Oberlin boys also came out on the losing end of the fifth-quarter play, falling 12-0 to Colby. "Our fifth-quarter team played a of the season," Coach Dick Ahlberg lot better than the score indicates," Coach Howland said. "They had a lot of hard hits and good offensive plays. 
