Oberlin team scheduled to play away


The Decatur Community High football team were scheduled to play in the bi-district playoffs Tuesday at Smith Center.

The Decatur Community High cross country boys came in 12th in the Class 2A State Championship race in Wamego on Saturday.

The Oberlin boys and freshman Rebecca Helm qualified for the state meet last weekend at the regional competition in Phillipsburg.

The boys came in third at the regional meet behind Sacred Heart of Salina and Trego Community High Helm came in 10th as an indi-

vidual runner, though the girls team placed fourth and did not qualify for

The top three teams and top 10 individuals won berths to the state

In the boys race, Stanton County of Johnson won the state championship with 44 points, followed by Quinter, 95; Deerfield, 105; Central (Burden), 130; Sacred Heart (Salina), 133; Wabaunsee, 134; Valley Heights, 169; Jefferson North, 201; Remington (Whitewater), 222; Peabody, 224; Trego (WaKeeney), 228; and Oberlin, 295.

Sophomore Andy Leitner was the first Oberlin runner over the finish line for the boys. He took 64th in 19 minutes, 46 seconds. After him were junior Teryn Grafel, 78th, 20:25; sophomore Aaron Helm, 82nd, 20:30; junior Kellen Doeden, 83rd, 20:33; junior Zeke Ruzicka, 93rd, 21:07; junior Scott Miller, 103rd, 23:06; and junior Brent Stallman, 104th, 23:37.

Rebecca Helm came in 36th in the girls race in 14:05.
