CHARTER ORDINANCE NO. 14

CHARTER ORDINANCE AMENDING CHARTER ORDINANCE NO. 11 regarding the Transient Guest Tax

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF OBERLIN, KANSAS: Section 1: Section 2 of Charter Ordinance #11 is hereby amended to read as follows: A transient guest tax shall be levied in the City of Oberlin, Kansas at a rate of three percent upon the gross rental receipts derived from or paid by transient guests for lodging or sleeping accommodations, exclusive of charges for incidental services or facilities, in any hotel or motel

Section 2: <u>Publication</u>. This Charter Ordinance shall be published once each week for two consecutive weeks in the official city news-

paper.
Section 3: Effective Date. This Charter Ordinance shall take effect 61 days after final publication unless a sufficient petition for a referendum is filed, requiring a referendum to be held on the ordinance as provided in Article 12, Section 5, of the Constitution of the State of Kansas, in which case this Charter Ordinance shall become effective upon approval by a

majority of the electors voting thereon.


