Player statistics counted up

The Decatur Community High boys basketball squad ended its season Feb. 28 in substate play, and along the way the players piled up some interesting statistics.

Senior Lance Fortin, 6 foot, 2 inches, led the team in two-point field goals. He made 113 out of 224 tries for 50 percent. He hit 14 of 46 three-point tries for 30 percent and 46 of 75 free throws for 61 percent. He led the team with 314 total points, and had 61 assists, 29 steals and 61 fouls.

Junior Andy Inman, 6-1, was the second-highest scorer, hitting 205 points. He made 58 of 118 two-point tries for 49 percent and 17 or 40 three-point attempts for 42 percent. He sank 38 or 52 free throws for 73 percent. He also had 33 assists, 13 steals and 35 fouls.

Junior Teryn Grafel, 5-11, added 178 points to the team totals, hitting 78 of 129 two-point tries for 60 percent and 22 of 47 free throws for 47 percent. He had 28 assists, 24 steals and 52 fouls.

Junior Jesse Juenemann, 5-10,

sank 56 of 111 two-point shots for 50 percent, 10 of 33 three pointers for 30 percent and 20 for 48 free throws for 42 percent for 162 total points. He had 54 assists, 31 steals and 52 fouls.

Junior Jason Thomas, 5-11, sank 123 points for the Red Devils. He made 34 of 69 two-point shots for 49 percent, 15 of 55 three pointers for 27 percent and 16 of 36 free throws for 44 percent. He had 35 assists, 28 steals and 32 fouls.

Junior Josh Fortin, 5-11, hit 33 of 95 two-point tries for 35 percent and 16 of 36 free throws for 44 percent. He had 23 assists, 10 steals and 45 fouls.

Senior Andy Anderson, 6-2, made 25 of 66 two-pointers for 38 percent and 14 of 33 free throws for 42 percent, and 64 total points. He had 40 assists, 17 steals and 46 fouls.

Sophomore Andy Leitner, 5-10, made four of 13 two-point attempts for 31 percent and six of 10 free throws for 60 percent for 14 total points. He had two assists, two steals and five fouls.

Sophomore Kyle Glodt, 5-10, made two of five two-pointers for 40 percent and one three point shot for 100 percent for 10 points. He had one assist, two steals and a foul.

Sophomore Jace Robinson, 5-11, hit two of eight free throws for 25 percent. He had one assist, one steal and one foul.

Sophomore Kurt Olson, 6, hit one of eight two-point shots for 12 percent. He had one assist, one steal and three fouls.

Junior Brett Stallman, 5-11, had three assists, a steal and two fouls.

Sophomore Nolan May, 6-3, had an assist and a foul.

Freshman Ace Manning, 5-6, substituted in varsity but had no statistics.

As a team, the Red Devils made 1,162 points, 808 from two pointers, 171 from three pointers and 183 free throws. They made 48 percent of their two pointers, 32 percent of their three pointers and 52 percent of their free throws. They had 282 assists, 160 steals and 336 fouls.

Kid Wrestlers head for state

Five Oberlin Kid wrestlers will travel to Topeka this weekend for the state tournament.

Oberlin sent 10 wrestlers to the district competition in Dodge City on Saturday. Of those one came in first, two second, one third, one fourth, one fifth and one sixth. The top four places in each age/weight category get to attend the state meet.

Oberlin's only champion was Denton Bailey, who came in first at age 16 and under and 155 pounds. Kade Brown, 10 and under/82 pounds, and Dayton Dreher, 8 and under/67 pounds took third. Wesley Geishler, 8 and under, 49 pounds took third and Garrit Peters, 16 and under/160 pounds came in fourth.

Denton, Kade, Dayton, Wesley and Garrit will all get to go to state on Friday and Saturday. Regent Erickson, age 8 and under/88, came in fifth, and Kelly Brown, 8 and under/70, took sixth. Tabor Erickson, 8 and under/55; Cameron Nedland, 16 and under/145; and Gage Reichert, 16 and under/130, did not place.
