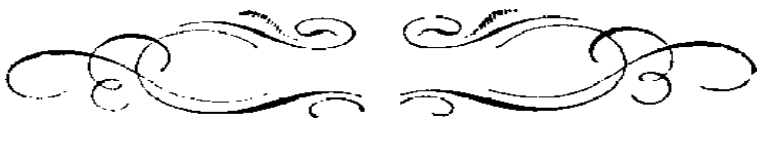
Program offers second sign-up

The Natural Resources Conservation Service is offering a second sign-up for the Environmental Quality Incentives Program, known as EQIP.

Cutoff date for applications for fiscal year 2005 is May 20. Anyone who has farmed or ranched for less than 10 years, or has limited resources, must apply before the cut-

off.
