The Decatur Community High 12.82 seconds. girls finished third and the boys fifth at the annual Oberlin Invitational inches. track meet last Tuesday.

The Oberlin girls, who had finshed first in the previous four meets, came in just four points behind the leader, St. Francis. The Lady Indians took first with 85 followed by Rawlins County, 84; Oberlin, 81; Hoxie, 66; WaKeeney, 59; and Smith Center, 57. Oakley, Norton, Grinnell, Goodland and Phillipsburg were also at the meet.




