Oberlin girl places in races

Oberlin fifth grader Kiah Blau placed in races in Oakley and McCook last month.

Kiah, the daughter of David and Stephanie Blau of Oberlin, took second in the 100-meter dash in 15.4 seconds and fourth in the 200-meter dash in 33.02 at an Amateur Athletic Union track meet May 7 in Oakley.

She took first place in the 200-meter dash on May 14 in a USA Track and Field meet in McCook in 32.17, and third in the 100-meter dash in 14.72.

She was fast enough to qualify for USA Track and Field regional competition in Omaha on Saturday and Sunday, June 18-19.

Grant to help students renewed for college

A grant for student support services at Colby Community College has been renewed by the U.S. Department of Education for \$200,000 this year.

"This is the 16th year for the program at CCC," said President Mikel Ary. "If you average the amount of this federal grant of \$200,000 per year, it has really served the college and the area well. A prime ingredient to the success of our grant project relates to the quality of leadership that director Monica Kane provides."

Student Support Services provides personal and academic support to first generation students. Traditionally, he said, this group is under-represented at colleges and universities in America.

The program provides tutoring; study groups; career, academic and personal counseling; transfer coordination; workshops; and cultural enrichment. Federal regulations limit the number of students in this program to 200 per year.

Cars, trucks, tractors, horses and floats will be on Main Street at 2 p.m. during the annual parade. Line up will be at 1 p.m. at the grade school.

A classic car show and an antique tractor show will both be held from 3 to 6 p.m. at the park.

At 1 p.m., a trap shoot will be held at Roadside Park, while Bingo will start at 2 p.m. at the senior center.

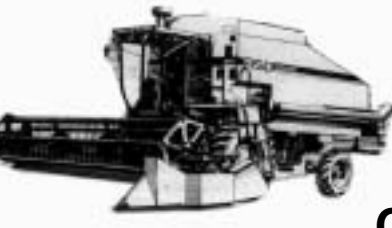

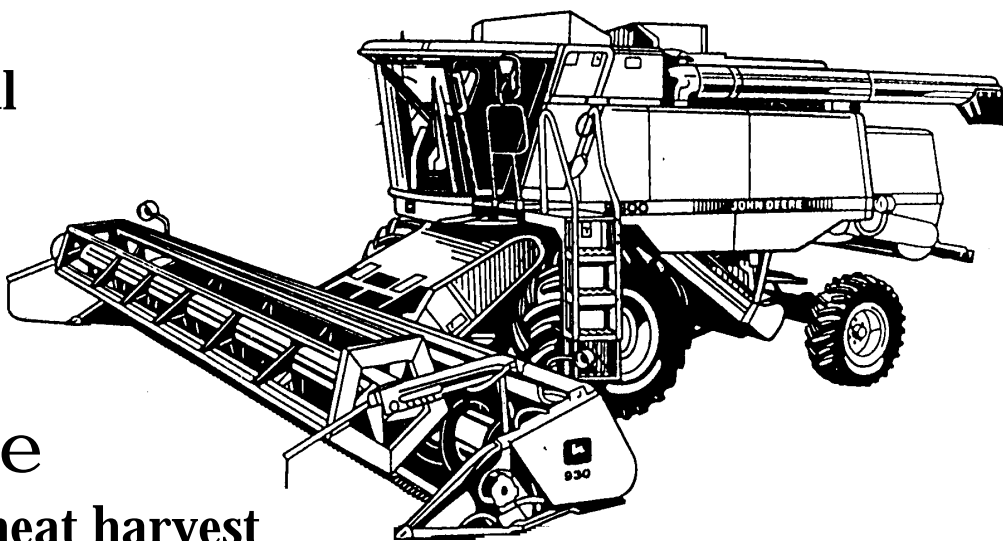
