1. B - Be positive. Philippians 4:8 says, "... whatever things be of good report, think on these things." Keep your mind on the positive instead of the negative.
2. L - Look for purpose. Don't let tests and trials get you down. They come our way to strengthen us and increase our faith. Look for the purpose God has for your life. Look for things to do for Him.
