# Races take 2 days Seven classes take to track at speedway

**By MIKE HUGHES** The regular six divisions were in action Saturday and Sunday nights at the Oberlin Speedway, joined by the 305 Sprint Cars on Saturday.

Saturday's IMCA Modified feature saw three leaders in a 20-lap race. Randy Wilson took the lead on the opening lap, but was passed by Rick Schwab on the following lap. Heat 1 winner David Murray Jr. of Oberlin worked his way through the field and took over the top spot on lap 7, then held on for the win.

A caution on lap 19 bunched the field and set up a green-whitecheckered finish, but Murray was able to hold off Schwab and Wilson. Heat 2 winner Nick Tubbs was fourth with Tyson Garrison fifth.

Selden's Jason Rogers scored the win in the 15-lap IMCA Stock Car feature. Rogers passed leader Josh Hudson on lap 5 to take command and edged out Jason Schoenberger at the wire. Hudson finished third, followed by Jason Davis and Kelly Ford. Hudson and Tyler Hahn won the two heat races.

Kelly Karnopp of Norton was able to get around leader B.J. Dauer on lap 8 of the 12-lap IMCA Hobby Stock feature for the win. Dauer finished a close second, trailed by Brady Schoen, heat 2 winner Brian Conness, and Barry Schoen. Austin Davis won the other heat race.

Kensington's Donald Dodds dove under Brent Moss in turn 1 on the final lap of the Bomber feature to claim the win. Moss was second, followed by Matt Giesenhagen and heat race winner Jeremy Blackwill.

Cruiser heat race winners Joe and Jim Carter of Russell took the lead at the halfway mark of the feature race from Jeff Doty and Chad Fields to rack up the victory. Doty and Fields finished in the runner-up spot, with Norman and Brian Weichman third, and Jebb and Gerry Tally fourth.

John Werner of Palisade, Neb., led all 10 laps of the Classic Modified feature. Karl Wickizer made a late charge but had to settle for second. Devin Allen, heat 2 winner





Marty Clark, Robby Haines and Doug Holzmeister completed the top five. Heat race winners were Nick Tubbs, Murray, and Randy Wilson.

Rogers also was able to repeat, leading the final 12 laps of the 15lap IMCA Stock Car feature for the win. Josh Hudson was second, followed by heat race winner Tyler Hahn, Bryan Lariviere and Jason Davis.

Karnopp found his way back to the winner's circle, but it wasn't easy. He passed leader Adam Balthazor on lap 10 of the 12-lap IMCA Hobby Stock feature and held on to the checkers. Balthazor beat out B.J. Dauer by inches for second, with Dustin McClurg and Brady Schoen finishing fourth and fifth. The red flag flew on lap 3 when heat 1 winner Gene Sneath of Plainville made contact with another car on the backstretch and rolled off the back side.
